

APPENDIX 60:

REVISITING THE 1763 MARYLAND ACADIAN CENSUS (revisions made in April-June 2025)

First of all, this document does not intend to replace Wood, *A Guide to Acadians in Maryland in the Eighteenth and Nineteenth Centuries* (AIMd), pages 70-186, in its entirety. Its purpose is to supplement that section, make a handful of corrections, and provide ample, valuable additions regarding parents and marriages. New data is italicized. Unless noted here, information on Acadian Neutral children in AIMd (1995) remains the same.

Since the publication of AIMd, excellent works, such as Dr. Stephen A. White's long-anticipated *Dictionnaire Généalogique des Familles Acadiennes* (1999 and subsequent corrections that can be found online), Paul Delaney's *La Liste de Winslow Expliquée* (2020; noted as PD), and Ronnie-Gilles Le Blanc's chapter in *Du Grand Dérangement à La Déportation* (2005; noted as R-GL), have all added enormous clarity and precision for researchers. As a side note, much of the previous genealogical work in AIMd was accomplished in the 1980s with resources available at the Center for Louisiana Studies, University of Louisiana at Lafayette (then known as the University of Southwestern Louisiana). Merci, as well, to Steve Cormier and his *Acadians in Gray* website.

Note that 'accurate' spelling of family names has long depended on family tradition, local authorities, priests, scribes, and other sources responsible for these variations. In the following document, a choice was made to standardize those surnames to reflect the most used form of the name in past documentation. The alphabetical order of this list, however, holds true to the 1763 transcriptions from the Maryland *recensement* in AIMd.

Castille was buried in St. Martinville, Louisiana, on 20 Oct 1784, at the age of 52 (SM Ch: vol 3, #17). Osite died on 15 Oct 1810 at the home of their daughter Marie-Marthe and Marie-Marthe's third husband, Auguste Bigot.</i>

This observation was deleted by White in 2007 (see online Corrections, 2007, p. 92)! So, all commentary on Jean Sapin, Annapolis, is now up in the air. Nevertheless, Paul Delaney acknowledged in 2022 that Sapin-Landry children were in MD: Bonaventure Le Blanc, Baltimore, 1763 (Jean Sapin-Anne Landry) and the family of Blaise Le Blanc (deceased), whose widow, Marie-Josèphe Melanson, soon after married Pierre Poirier.
